CITY OF MONROE SEEKS VOLUNTEERS FOR ANNUAL RIVER RAISIN CLEAN-UP DAY

(MONROE, MI –, 2018) – The City of Monroe will be hosting the annual River Raisin Clean–Up Day on Saturday, July 21, 2018, beginning at 9:00 AM at the Soldiers and Sailors Park Pavilion on East Front Street. Event concludes at approximately noon. Volunteer Clean–Up Days are organized by the City of Monroe Commission on the Environment every late summer or early fall.

River Raisin clean up days take place in many of the communities along the Raisin's winding shores. This year, there will be 5 sections of the river targeted, via 6 access points.

Volunteers are always needed for this community pride project, and can work all three hours, or just part of the time. Light, medium, and heavy duty jobs will be available for individuals, families, teams, organizations and businesses to lend a hand clearing the river of debris. Supplies including gloves and boots will be provided. Flat bottom boats or canoes for debris collection welcome. Launch will be available via various access points after the initial meetup at Soldiers and Sailors Park Pavilion.
